# A NOTE FROM OUR CEO

For 45 years, CHAT has been the go-to place for children with few—if any—other options. In 2023, we built on that legacy, doubling the number of scholarships from 2022 and providing them to 72% of clinic clients. We began providing Early Intervention services, where underresourced families face long waitlists, and brought summer programming to five community partner sites. We grew our team to meet increasing demand for our services and will grow more this year. Last year's \$128K in scholarships also will increase in 2024, as we form larger community partnerships and expand CHAT's reach.

Your donations help us tear down barriers to access and bring life-changing therapy to more children. **We could not do it without your support.** 



# **ADVOCACY IS OUR MIDDLE NAME**

CHAT SLPs continue to be a trusted resource to families navigating a complex system, including schools, insurance bureaucracy and informational resources to get their children much-needed services.

#### The following are several examples of CHAT staff living our advocacy mission:

- When a parent was hitting roadblocks in making changes in their child's IEP, CHAT SLP Shanah was able to step in and be 'on mom's team' to advocate for literacy goals to be outlined in the student's IEP.
- CHAT SLP Katie was asked to speak to her clinic client's school team and share information and approaches to communication, as the client's mother had been so impressed with the strengthsbased and affirming approaches used by all the CHAT SLPs her child has seen.
- CHAT SLP Zoë advocated for her student to get a full academic re-evaluation for her IEP because of struggles in other subjects, and the student now has accommodations in Social Studies and Math outlined in her IEP.
