A NOTE FROM OUR CEO

For 47 years, CHAT has been the go-to place for children with few—if any—other options. In 2025, we made therapy even more accessible, serving 30 schools, eight preschools, and four nonprofit partner sites. We grew our Early Intervention practice to 10 SLPs supporting families throughout Chicagoland.

All in, we changed more than 1000 children's lives last year, while mentoring 34 students in speech-language pathology. Last December, we held our first Speak Easy Gala, honoring a leader in communication justice and champion of inclusion. If you missed it, this year's Speak Easy Gala is November 14th.




2025 Speak Easy Gala



ADVOCACY IS OUR MIDDLE NAME

CHAT SLPs continue to be a trusted resource to families navigating a complex system, including schools, insurance bureaucracy and informational resources to get their children much-needed services:

- The mom of one of Ms. Katie's clinic clients successfully advocated for her son to stay in his public school and not be placed in a therapeutic school...and got the school district to start a program of self-contained classrooms at the general education schools for students like her son! Katie was there every step of the way, reassuring and supporting mom toward this exceptional result.
- Ms. Milijana helped one of her students successfully self-advocate in the school setting. When he couldn't remember the editing password for his AAC device, he confidently told the SLP helping him to "call Ms. Mili—she knows!"
- Equip for Equality, our nonprofit partner for criminal legal system work, chose CHAT for our neurodiversity-affirming, rapport-first approach when they needed in-home services for a nonspeaking AAC user as a result of due process proceedings.
